Executive Summary

The event, titled A Shift from SDG Dialogues and SDG Corners to SDG Pavilions, was a milestone in reimagining platforms for promoting the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Hosted by the GCSAYN Secretariat on 10 December 2024, this virtual gathering convened 92 participants consisting of global experts, researchers, development experts, farmers, students, youth leaders, and agri-food stakeholders to discuss the evolution of SDG platforms from dialogues and corners to more expansive and interactive pavilions.

The event attracted a diverse audience, including representatives from governments, civil society, private sector entities, and academia. It underscored the interconnected nature of the SDGs and their reliance on inclusive, collaborative approaches. Speakers shared insights, key recommendations, and actionable commitments, emphasizing the importance of scaling up investment in SDG-related initiatives, fostering youth leadership, and leveraging innovative platforms like SDG Pavilions to drive global impact.


The event had as aim:


